



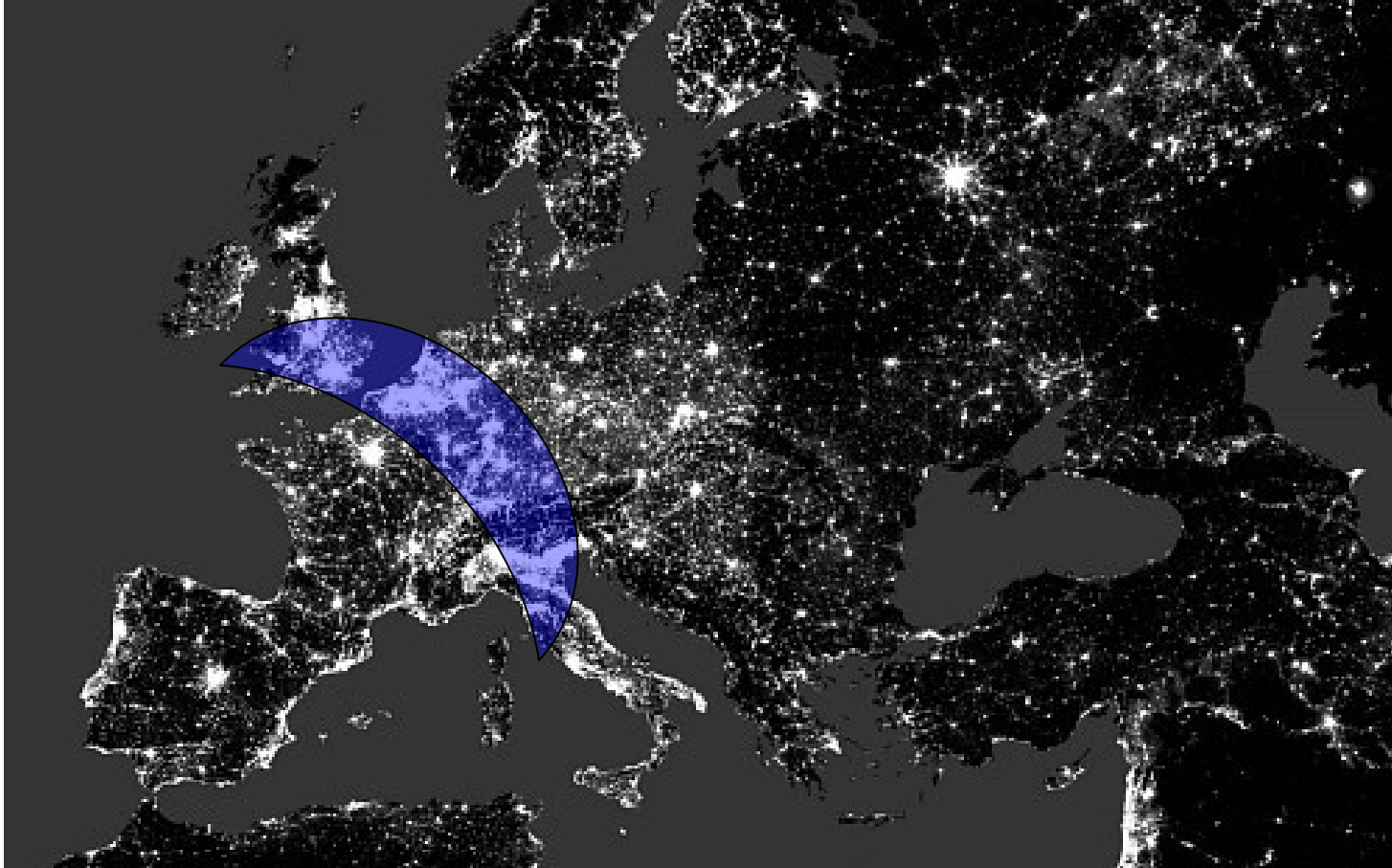

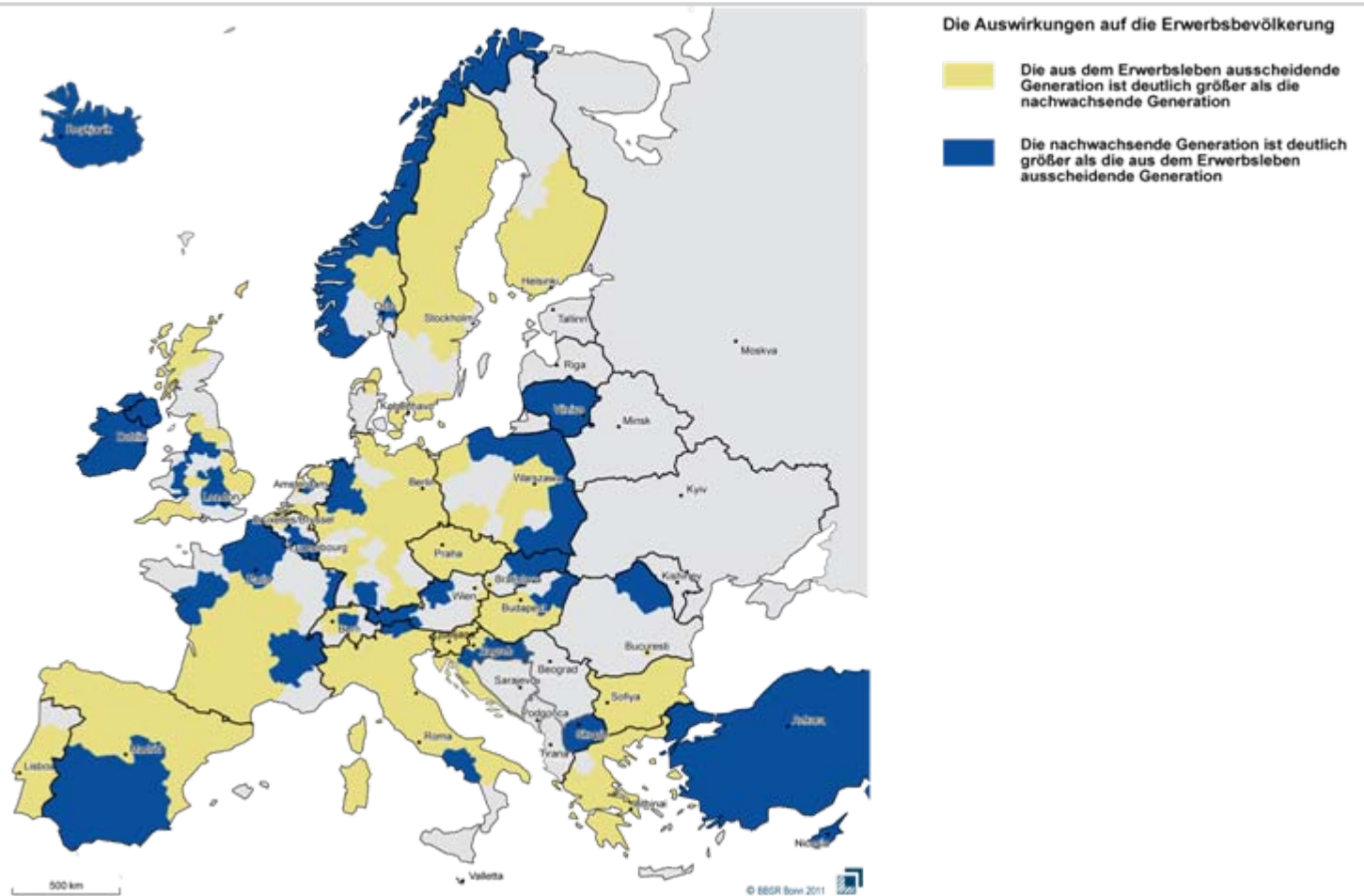

Europe by night

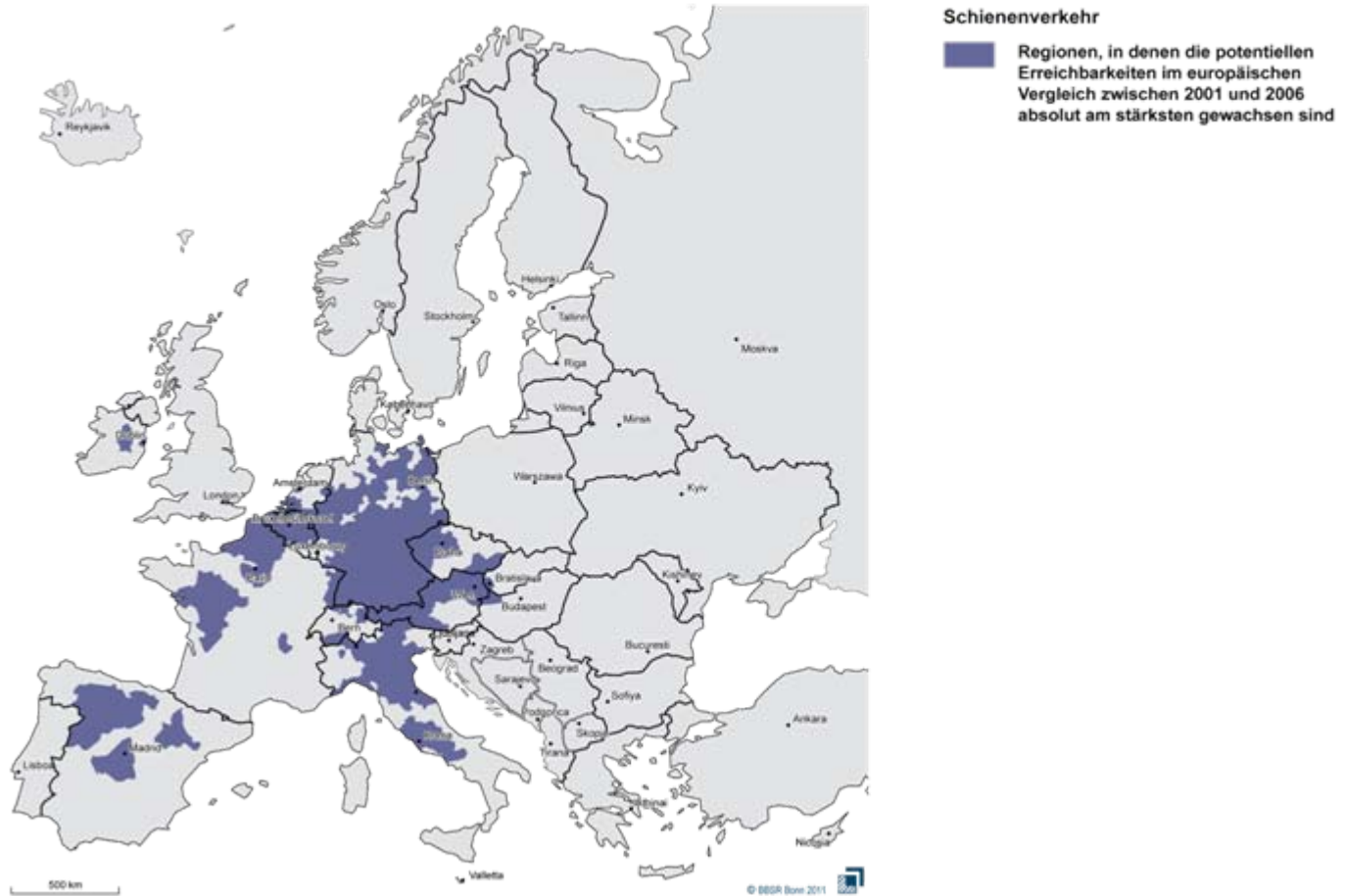

Territorial Agenda of the European Union 2020

- Polycentric and balanced development
- Integrated development of cities, rural and specific regions
- Territorial integration of CBC and transnational functional regions
- Global competitiveness based on local economies
- Territorial connectivity
- Connecting ecological, landscape and cultural values



What does this mean in practice?

- A permanent process of member state co-operation:
- NTCCP (UDG), Directors General Meetings, Informal Ministerial Meetings



What does this mean in practice?

- Translate the principles into policies:
- Action programme for the implementation of the Territorial Agenda - Individual MS undertook topic-related action – mitigated success
- Next step: „Roadmap“



What does this mean in practice?

- „Mainstreaming“ principles into sectoral policies:
- The notion of „Territorial Cohesion“ in the Lisbon Treaty
- „A common responsibility of EU and MS for the European space“
- „Spatial solidarity“



What does this mean in practice

- „Mainstreaming“ of principles into sectoral policies
- Polish presidency approach: start with European Cohesion Policy
- Appropriate moment: Legislative proposals of the European Commission published October 6
- ETC-INTERREG, „Local development“, „Urban dimension“
