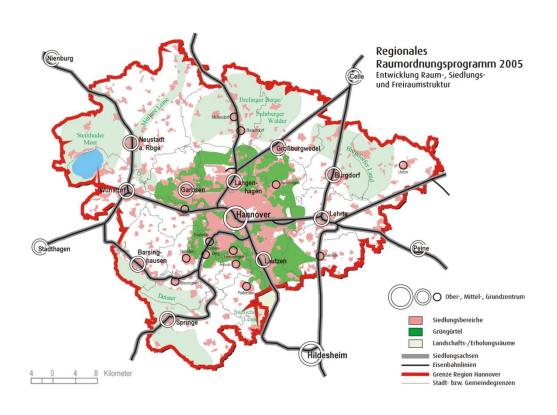

The Hannover region





- monocentric urban region
- Hannover as core city
- **2,300** km²
- about 1.1 m. inhabitants

Region Hannover: Towns and municipalities

- Two-tier system of local authorities
- Regional level and 21 municipalities
- The region is organized similar to counties (Landkreise)
- The region is responsible for many state authority tasks

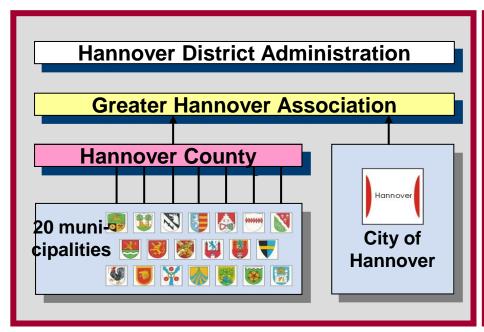

- 1959: The idea of a Greater Hannover Association first floated
- 1963 Greater Hannover Association (210 municipalities in 5 counties and 3 state districts)
- 1970 Greater Hannover Transport
- 1974 Reorganisation of local government: new county with 20 municipalities around the core city,
- 1980-1992: Constrained powers
- 1994: Zoo
- 1996 "Blue Paper": blueprint for reorganization (authors: 3 chief executives)



Structure before 2001 and today







We are responsible for the following tasks among others:

- Business and employment promotion
- Regional planning and development
- Public transport and regional roads
- Recreation areas and zoological garden
- Vocational schools
- Public health services and hospitals
- Nature conservation and environmental protection
- Waste management
- Youth and social welfare
- Public safety



Political organisation of the Region

- Regional council with 84 directly elected members
- Regional board
- 15 regional sectoral committees (partly because of special legal provisions)
- President of the Region (directly elected, member of the regional council)
- no municipal chamber

PLANNING GUIDELINES AND VISIONS SINCE 1965



Greater Hannover association in the sixties

Primary goals:

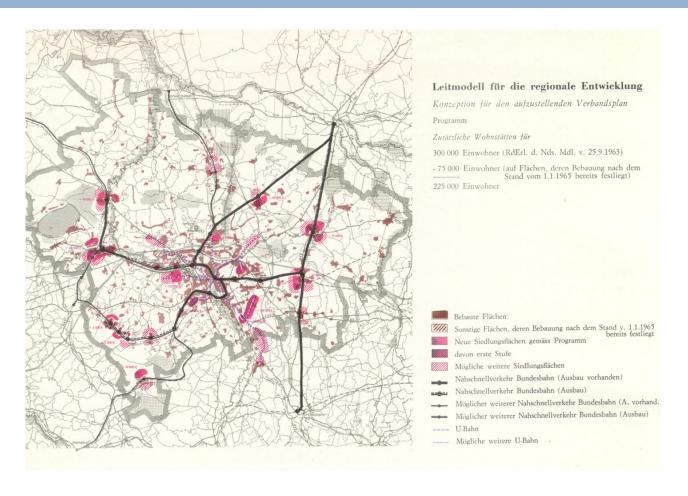
- strengthening the economic area of central Lower Saxony
- overcoming local government and state district borders
- Not just physical planning, but fostering regional development

Activities in the Sixties:

- Regional planning guidelines, preparing a regional plan
- Coordinating public transport
- Developing industrial sites
- Improving recreational areas

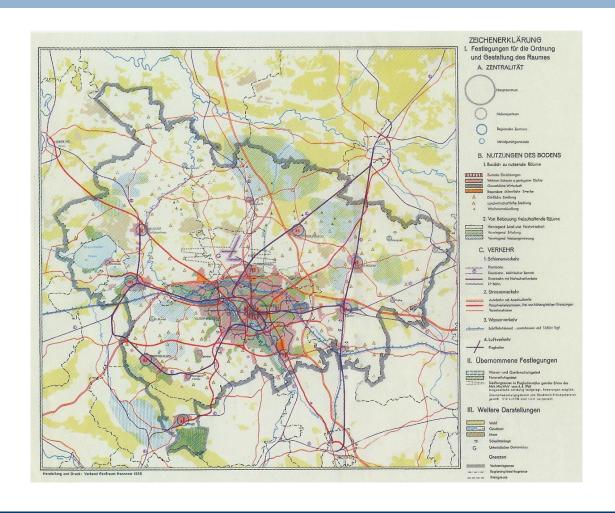








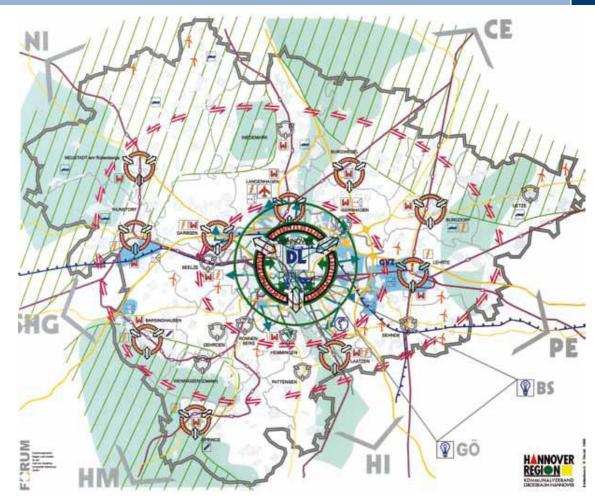
1967: the first regional plan







1996: guiding priciples for a new regional plan (RROP 1996)

The Greater Hannover Association (until 2001) "Region as a strategy"



- Until 2001 political and administrative division between core city and surrounding municipalities
- Greater Hannover Association (KGH) as a common institution of core city and surrounding county
- 4 tasks (planning, public transport, economic development and recreation)
- Motto of the Greater Hannover Association (KGH): "Our task is the region"
- KGH: leading role in laying foundations of the new institution "Region Hannover" between 1996 and 2001
- 38 years of regional cooperation (in particular in the field of public transport): important precondition for broad public acceptance of "Region Hannover"



2005: guiding priciples for a new regional plan (RROP 2005)

Contents (only text for the guiding priciples):

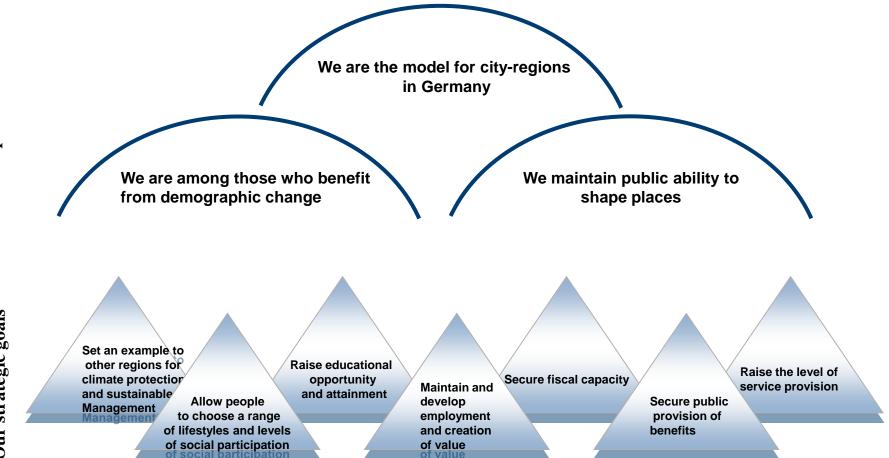
- Regional planning for people in the Hannover region (demographic change, social cohesion, gender mainstreaming)
- Challenges for Hannover region: pressure on space, changing economic structure, international competition, local and regional cooperation)
- Competences of Hannover region (quality of life, regional approach, strong capital, energy and climate protection, mobility)
- Goals and priorities (integration of settlement and transport, protection of natural resources and open spaces, shaping of "metropolitan region Hannover-Braunschweig-Göttingen")



New chances since 2001

- Integrated political and administrative approach
- Region Hannover as a result of a bottom-up process
- 38 years of regional experience
- Directly elected council
- Broad tasks and competences
- Good atmosphere in the "family" of local authorities
- Strong planning tradition

STRATEGIC PLANNING IN THE HANNOVER REGION?



Regional planning in Germany

- Compulsory regional planning
- Different organizations in the federal states (Länder)
- Mostly planning associations
- In Lower Saxony Counties, county boroughs, planning association for Greatre Braunschweig, Region Hannover
- Regional plans have to be in accordance with the state planning (Landes-Raumordnungspläne)
- Local authorities, other public bodies and in some cases also private bodies are bound to the rules of the regional plan
- Countermovement principle in the planning system

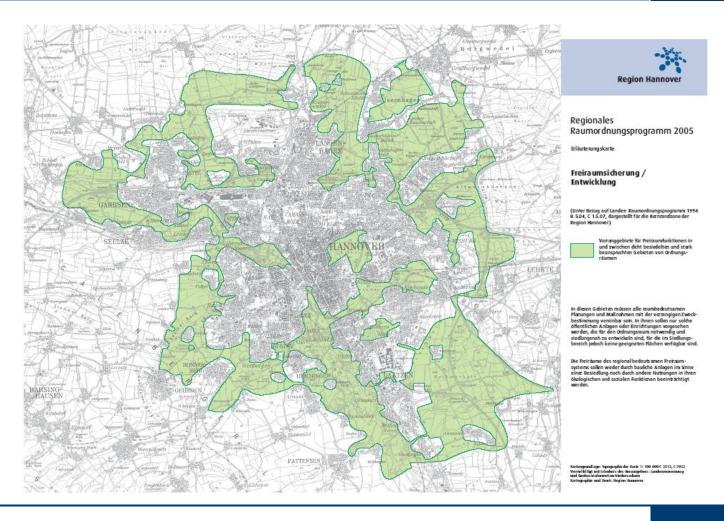
Strategic themes in Region Hannover regional planning



- Settlement planning in connection with public transport
- Strong core city, but also strong cities in the surrounding (principle of "decentral concentration")
- Preparing and developing industrial areas (cooperation between regional planning and economic development divisions)
- Preventing urban sprawl to keep quality of landscape (open spaces, hierarchy of settlements, restrictions for ca. 130 small villages)
- Climate protection and fostering new energy technologies
- Restrictions on shopping centres to preserve retail functions in the town centres

Open spaces with settlement restrictions in the regional core (binding structure in 1:50.000 scale)

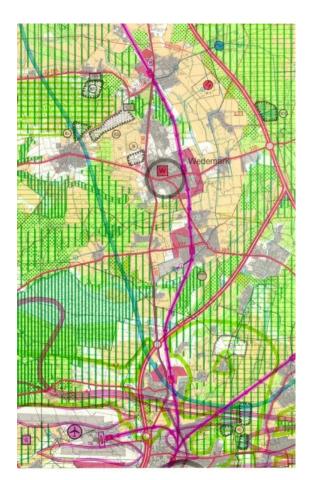






Other themes of regional planning

- Priority areas for housing and industrial estates
- Priority areas for recreation
- Protection against flood
- Settlement restrictions around Hannover Airport
- Mineral resources
- Infrastructure (transport, energy, waste)



Region Hannover

Well done?

- Well-established regional planning
- Clear physical structure
- Connection between settlement and public transport development

but....

- More physical than strategic planning
- Missing structural illustrations
- Sometimes primarly perceived as prevention; political "double bind"
- Missing links between regional planning and some sectoral policies
- No regular monitoring

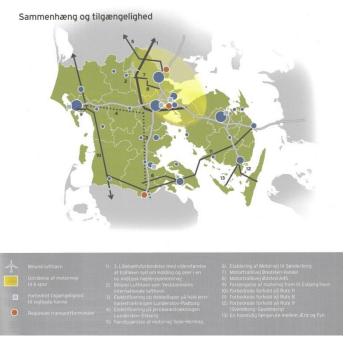


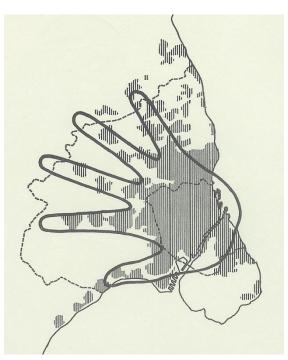
Ideas for a new regional plan (RROP 2016)

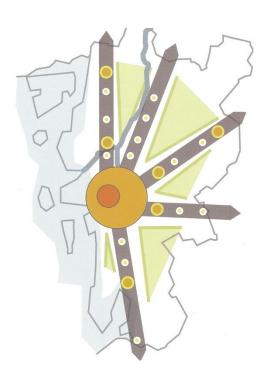
- Broad public participation (all 2012)
- Connection between strategic goals of Region Hannover and regional planning
- Strategic guidelines before physical planning
- "What do we want" and "how can we reach that goal"
- Optimizing climate protection and climate change prevention
- Demographic change
