# 7: Planning Reform in England

## One "culture change" after another

- □ UK planners changed the culture from land use to spatial planning with the 2004 Planning Act
- Regional Spatial Strategies and Local Development Frameworks promoted spatial planning
- □ The Coalition Government now wants the "default answer" to planning applications to be "yes"
- □ The planning system is being simplified to reduce obstacles to economic growth in the recession

# 9: New ways to shape the future

#### Global issues and local solutions

- □ Economic change, climate change and technological change are making this a much smaller world
- Planners must find truly sustainable ways of guiding urbanisation and tackling poverty and inequality

- □ Planners must work with local people, the business community and politicians at all levels

# 11: Focusing on Europe

## **UK and German approaches**

- Regional strategic planning is disappearing in England but survives elsewhere in the UK
- ☐ The "duty to cooperate" in England aims to ensure LPAs and LEPs work together for common goals
- □ The regional approach to integrated planning is strong in Germany and several other European countries
- Integration is essential across political groupings and between all elements of sustainable development
