

SPATIAL VISIONS FOR THE ZERO-CARBON AND RESILIENT FUTURE OF THE LUXEMBOURG FUNCTIONAL REGION

Launched by the <u>Department of Spatial Planning</u> of the Ministry of Energy and Spatial Planning of the Grand-Duchy of Luxembourg, the urban-architectural and landscape consultation entitled <u>Luxembourg in Transition – Spatial visions for the low-carbon and sustainable future of the Luxembourg functional region aims to gather strategic spatial planning proposals and produce "towards 2050" ecological transition scenarios for the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and neighbouring border territories. It was inspired by other large-scale consultations that have been conducted, such as those for Greater Paris and Greater Geneva.</u>

OBJECT

Luxembourg in Transition is a process that encourages the formation of multidisciplinary teams from diverse backgrounds for a new transitional and resilient approach to spatial planning.

CALL FOR TENDERS

Luxembourg in Transition is aimed at professionals, but also universities, technical institutes and research organisations with expertise in the fields of spatial planning, urban planning, landscape and architecture, supported by environmental disciplines as well as the humanities and social sciences.

4 MAIN PHASES

Preliminary phase – call for applications

15 OCTOBER 2020 - 22 JANUARY 2021

Stage 1 – methodological framework for the transition project (14 teams)

1 FEBRUARY – 4 JUNE 2021

Stage 2 – the transition project adapted to the cross-border functional region (7 teams)

14 JUNE – 24 DECEMBER 2021

Stage 3 – the transition project is divided into phases and demonstration projects (4 teams)

SPECIFICATIONS

The specifications define the framework terms and conditions of this call for tenders under the European open tendering procedure as well as the terms and conditions of the implementing contract following the award of the contract to the bidding teams selected by the contracting authority. The tender documents shall be written in French and include a version translated into English as an annex. In the event of any discrepancy between the two versions, the French version shall prevail.
